The Center for Innovative Pharmacy Education & Research (CIPhER) provides pharmacy educators and education scholars with innovative, evidence-based professional development programs and consulting. CIPhER's aim is to enhance the quality, effectiveness and efficiency of pharmacy education practice, scholarship and research locally, nationally and globally.

# **PROGRAMMING SUMMARY**

29 professional development programs were offered by CIPhER. New programming this year included:

- Carolina Cancer Nanotechnology T32 training
- Participation in the National Rx Writing Challenge

2 visiting scholars were hosted aimed at increasing the School's understanding and use of Entrustable Professional Activities and Performance Assessment

**864 participants**, in total, attended *CIPhER* programs

**519 individuals** participated in those 29 CIPhER programs, including:

81-1/4 hours of professional education were provided; including 38 hours of CE offered through ACPE

28 hours of scholarly support were provided to 21 participants as part of the RxWritingChallenge
